

Transportation:

- Drive from Port Townsend to the Bainbridge Ferry. Park your car and walk on.
- Walk from the Ferry to Pioneer Square Light Rail Station on 3rd and James. (Walk up 2 blocks, turn right and down to James).
- Take the new Light Rail one stop to the International District or continue walking south on 5th.
- Follow directions on map to the 3 main sites and choose a place for lunch on your own from the many choices in the neighborhood.

There are many choices throughout the neighborhood. Here are 4 that are well reviewed:

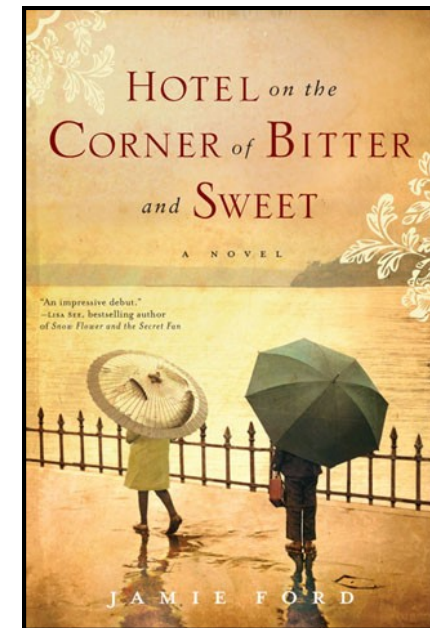
- Jade Garden (Dim Sum) 424 7th Ave S.
